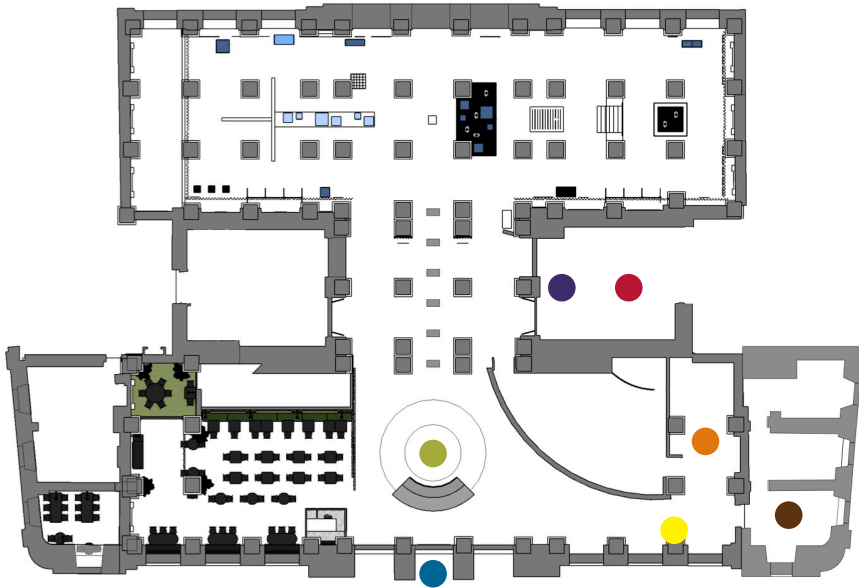
Welcome to the

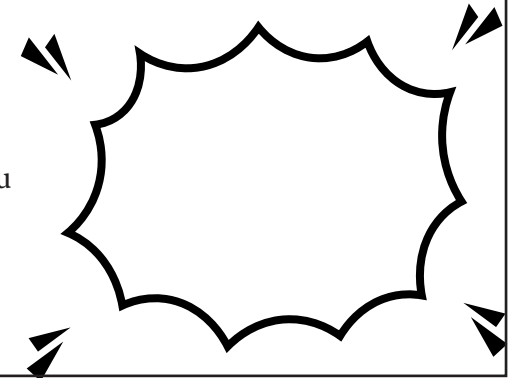
